

The Oblate Community in Heaven Welcomes Fr. Clarence Zachman, OMI

Father Clarence J. Zachman, OMI, 103, peacefully answered the divine call to join Jesus Christ on a new pilgrimage, passing away on Friday, January 19, 2024, at the Benedictine Living Community at the National Shrine of Our Lady of the Snows in Belleville, IL. He was the eldest Missionary Oblate of Mary Immaculate in the world.

Fr Clarence was born on November 2, 1920, to the late Louis and Philomena, nee Becker, Zachman, in Rogers, Minnesota. Fr. Clarence took First Vows as a Missionary Oblate in August 1943, in Mission, TX. He was ordained a Missionary Oblate priest at Saint Paul's Cathedral in Saint Paul, MN, on June 5, 1948.

He joined the United States Air Force in 1961. As Chaplain, he was promoted to Lieutenant Colonel during his 20 years of service. He finished his traveling in 1989 when he was assigned to various ministries in Belleville, Illinois.

During this time, he coined the phrase, "Jesus loves you and so do l." His last assignments were at St. Henry's Oblate Community in Belleville, and as chaplain at the Benedictine Living Community. Let us remember a life lived in devotion, spreading love and kindness.
