Pilgrims of Hope & the Jubilee Year

In this year of grace, the Holy Year, we are called to recognize that hope is the belief that God is present in all things. There are many situations in life where one may want to give up. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC1819) gives us the "Hope of Abraham" which is "Hoping against hope, he believed..." (Romans 4:18) which means **never giving**

up, even when the odds are stacked against you, or expecting a particular outcome, even when it's decidedly unlikely, describing the significance of Abraham's faith. Abraham's faith is talked about in the book of Genesis.

Speaking about the recently begun jubilee year, Pope Francis concluded with "a wish for hope, which is a theological virtue, together with faith and charity," praying that "the new year bring us peace, fellow-ship, and gratitude." In his Christmas Day message, Pope Francis recalled, "the door of God's heart is always open; let us return to him. Let us return to the heart that loves us and forgives us."

With the activities of life one can get caught up in the doing of chores, the constant noise of life, the demands on time and energy, sometimes bringing one to a point where they just need a rest, a quiet place to renew the spirit and soul, resting the body and mind. 

Born into French high society, Eugene de Mazenod experienced life in a dysfunctional family. With God's healing help, he was freed to offer his gifts and talents for the good of others. Ordained in 1811, he called together his first group of missionaries in 1816. The Missionary Oblates of Mary Immaculate, named for his profound and tender respect for the Virgin Mary and to be close to the people, they began instructing neglected workers and street people of the area.

Father de Mazenod, in his preaching and teaching, taught them about love and the healing compassion of God. He was appointed Bishop of Marseille in 1837, and Archbishop in 1851. Bishop de Mazenod was beatified on October 19, 1975, and canonized by Pope John Paul II on December 3, 1995.

His apostolate consisted in the transformation of the world by the power of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. What Saint Eugene wanted to achieve was that, in Christ, each individual could become a fully complete person, an authentic Christian, a credible saint. Saint Eugene de Mazenod, Pray for us.
